For our new members, and there are over 230 of you, here's a little back-story.

We have been running since 1909, (a long time), and occupy prime real estate, including the best deck in Melbourne. We are a fishing club.

Our charter provides that we are a community angling club serving the local area, and that includes keeping our fees and charges as low as possible, so that anyone can join.

Part of the tradition involves diners clearing their own tables: plates and cutlery to the appropriate area —cleaned of excess food— plates stacked for easy clearing by the kitchen staff, and all glasses and empty bottles placed on the bar.

It's a great leveller. You never know who'll you be standing beside while scraping plates! We regularly have celebrities, top sports people, even movie stars. They enjoy being treated like just anyone else, and nothing keeps your feet on the ground like scraping-off cold chips.

Boathouse Report

Door Pins

All boat owners are reminded that the pins must be inserted back into the wooden plank after you have retrieved your boat, through the middle Boathouse beach doors.



It was noted that over the weekend someone had failed to do so. These pins are there for security, so that the doors can't be opened from the outside when no one is in attendance.

New Keys For Boathouse Boat Owners

We have been forced to change the key locks on the boathouse doors as we are unable to identify who currently has keys. This practice will now be done every five years, or as deemed necessary.

Each key will cost you \$20, and you will be required to sign for it in the key register, which is located with Amanda. You don't need to have a key, they are only for access to the boathouse via the beach doors, to save boat owners having to walk around to the fob door access (street side) when launching and retrieving their boats.

Old keys no longer work.

Obviously, boat owners have the choice to take up the key offer, it's not compulsory that you do so. If you sell your boat, you will be able to pass over the key and recover your \$20 from them.

All members that currently have boathouse access via their Fob will still be able to gain entry for Fish weigh-in etc - we will also be reviewing the fobs and ascertaining the necessity of each member's need for entry. But keys are in place exclusively for Boat owners. Each hire boat will also have one of these keys in the glove box.

The Boathouse is a restricted, and secure, zone so it's extremely important that we keep it as such, to protect our valued assets and belongings.



APYAC MEMBERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

APYAC is a member club with public responsibilities

Members are united in their desire to uphold the highest standards of behaviour to:

- protect the health and safety of the club's employees and contractors,
- ensure the provision of a safe, respectful, and enjoyable environment for members, and their guests; and
- protect the reputation of the Club.

As members we share the responsibility to uphold the highest standards of behaviour.

On joining the club members agree to be bound by this code and the club's rules and not behave in an unbecoming or dishonourable manner.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- offensive, discriminatory, racist, sexist, aggressive or otherwise inappropriate discourse or actions towards any other person,
- harassment of any kind,
- · unwanted physical contact,
- drunk or disorderly conduct.
- unsafe or unlawful conduct,
- abuse of, or inappropriate conduct towards, staff members,
- non-compliance with instructions given by staff members,
- consumption of alcohol in non-designated areas,
- smoking on the premises, including the Boathouse apron, and the downstairs entrance.
- possession or use of illicit substances,
- misuse of membership card and entitlements,
- acting dishonestly in any dealings with the club,
- any behaviour that brings the club into disrepute.

As a member you are expected to know the Rules and apply them. It is your responsibility to ensure your guests also understand the Club's expectations of them.

The club rules provide for disciplinary action when behaviour is contrary to the expectations set out in this code or the club rules. That action can include suspension or expulsion from the club.

Adherence to this Code will help us all ensure we have a safe, respectful, and pleasant environment in which to enjoy the great privileges of membership of APYAC.
