21st Birthday Parties

The Committee has decided to change the present policy regarding 21st Birthdays for members and their children.

Previously the Club had some bad experiences and banned them.

The new Policy is subject to a six month trial. If there are any bad experiences the ban may be reinstated earlier.

A summary is as follows:

No 18-year-old birthdays allowed.

21st birthdays for club members, or their children, permitted subject to the following requirements:

- The Member must be present at all times, and is personally responsible for the behaviour of all in attendance.
- A credit card guarantee of \$1000 is required, in addition to the catering and bar charges.
- For parties in excess of 50 people security will be arranged by the club at the member's expense.
- If there is any abuse of staff the bar will be closed.
- No guest who is intoxicated, in the opinion of the bar staff, will be served any further alcoholic beverages.
- Any guest causing trouble will be evicted by security.

The Committee wants to provide the facilities of the club to members as much as possible. It does however, have licencing responsibilities, as well as responsibilities to its staff and other members.

Maximum combined bag of King George Whiting that can be entered over 2 days is 30 fish max (please only record your total bag weight and heaviest fish for each day on the register).

I Don't Believe In Facebook

If you don't do Facebook, how about considering joining? The Club has an active page, lots of pics, and instant information. It makes it so easy for us to post items and is easy to see.

Many people are worried about making a page and being exposed. But there is no need to be. You can make your profile secret, and only follow one page ... ours! Search: likeapyac and you'll find us easily.

All you need is a name, an email account, a birth date and gender. You can make them up if you want!

First, an email address. You don't need to use your real name, I have one called WaratahAuthor (named after the Bay where I caught my first King George Whiting, and what I do).

If you worry about internet privacy, you can get yourself a free email address that you only use with Facebook, again, sharing few details. ProtonMail is one that I trust, click https://tinyurl.com/2p8zbed5

ProtonMail.com was created by scientists who met at CERN in 2014, and has grown to become the world's largest secure email service, safeguarding the communications of tens of millions of people in over 180 countries.

Follow the setup procedure for a basic account. You don't even have to provide a recovery email address, or phone number, if you wish to remain invisible.

To make a long, strong, password that you will remember, just type 'ProtonMail and the number of your grandmother's old phone number.' (If you're like me, your grandmother stopped using her number in 1967, but it's remembered forever).

Armed with your new email address, go to <u>facebook.com</u>

Making a new account on Facebook is easy, you need another password, your name, your email address, your date of birth, and your gender (you can choose 'them'). When setting-up accounts like these, I recommend using a fake birthday, to protect against identity theft.

Facebook will send an email to your new email account to confirm that you intend to make an account, from that email you copy the code into the space provided.
