

Boathouse Report

Centre Aisle Crane

The Centre aisle crane has been repaired after a major breakdown.

The end stoppers needed repairing, with metal ends being welded onto both the beach end, and above the toilet. In the past these had been replaced with temporary wooden pieces which had broken. They are important components to prevent the crane from sliding off the ends.

Compressor

The Compressor has had its regular service.

Storm Barriers

The wooden east aisle barriers are being replaced with aluminium. This is necessary as the staff found the current wooden models too heavy. They have to be regularly lifted to accept deliveries.

Gantry Pillar

The protective covering on one of the gantry pillars has come away and is being repaired.

Sand Removal

Three Boathouse sub-committee members undertook a training course, giving us more hands-on deck when it comes to moving the sand around, a regular nightmare.

Fire Marshall Course

Four Boathouse sub-committee members did the Fire Marshall course, organised by Elise. It highlighted some issues in the Boathouse, including the regular replacement of fire alarm batteries.

Let Someone Know Before You Go

We recently had an occasion where a member and his family were taking a boat out of the Boathouse without signing-out the log sheet.

Particularly worrying was that when told to sign out, no passengers were listed. In the event of a mishap, it is important that search crews know how many passengers were on board.

The above breaches of seamanship protocols are regarded as serious.

If you are lending your boat or kayak to someone, and that person is a Club member, not just a relation beyond spouse, it is your responsibility to ensure that they know what is required when taking a boat or kayak from the Boathouse, and that the following conditions are met:

- The member has been inducted into the use of the cranes, and boat launching and retrieving procedures,
- The Boathouse Captain has been informed of another party using your boat, and approved the members entry to the Boathouse, and
- A boat owner should not hand over an entry key / fob to the Boathouse without the consent of the Boathouse Captain.

I have sent out a copy of a document specific to the three Club Hire Boats, but it also contains important tips that all boat operators should heed. In particular, *'Let Someone Know Before You Go'*.

The President's Table.




We have installed a special table to encourage new members, singles and couples to visit the Club, hosted by a Committee Member when available.

Premier's Sustainability Awards



The Nature Conservancy

The 2022 Victorian Premier's Sustainability Awards are open for entries, but you'll have to move fast. The entries close on Sunday 1 May at 5:00 p.m.

The six award categories represent exceptional sustainability outcomes that can be delivered by projects and initiatives, and link to the globally accepted United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Simon Branigan explained to entrants about our award-winning Shellfish Reef project in this video made at the Club: https://tinyurl.com/SimonBraniganVideo

Following his excellent speech at our last meeting, Simon advises:

"We have seeded the shellfish reefs with 13.5 million Australian flat oysters and 2.7 million blue mussels, and

An oyster can filter up to 100 litres of water per day."

That's 36,500 litres per year, per oyster. 69 of them can filter an Olympic swimming pool, (which contains 2.5 million litres).

The 13.5 million seeded oysters filter 36,500 litres every year.

That's 494,750 million litres of water, every year.

No wonder the Bays are so clean!

Southern Bluespotted Flathead



Want to catch fish in the name of science and safeguarding the future of our fisheries?

The Victorian Fisheries Authority (VFA) is partnering with Victoria's fishers as part of this fisher-led, citizen science program which seeks to understand more about southern bluespotted flathead that inhabit Port Phillip Bay and are a highly valued recreational fish species.

Step 1: Catch a 'yank' flathead

Catch a southern bluespotted flathead (platycephalus speculator)

Step 2: Fillet fish

Fillet your legal (over 27cm) size fish, retaining complete frame (head, skeleton and organs).

Step 3: Bag & label fish

Fill out details (your name, email, date and location caught) on the waterproof paper provided with lead pencil, and place into a sealed bag with the fish frame.

Step 4: Freeze or take frame to drop-off location

Take your frozen fish frames to store in your fishing club freezer (or a designated dropoff location) for later collection and analysis by the VFA.
