

The Boathouse continues to be a hive of activity, new Fridges, new Freezer, updates to the fire safety systems, regular servicing of equipment, daily volunteer crew (our own Men's shed), bob cat and fire marshal training ... the list goes on and on.

Future Snapper & Flathead identification.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority's **Michelle Wenner** gave us an optimistic presentation about the recent Snapper Survey at the recent forum. Based on the huge spike of juveniles in 2017-8, they are predicting adult Snapper numbers to boom in the 2024-5 season.

She also outlined the citizen science program which seeks to understand more about southern bluespotted flathead that inhabit Port Phillip and explained how the 'frames' we collect are used by the scientists.

Here she lists her tips on identifying the five varieties we find in Victorian waters:

Southern bluespotted flathead (Platycephalus speculator)

Identifying features:

Scattered, widely spaced small blue to white spots over a sandy coloured body (with paler bottom)

Best distinguishing feature is the 2 opercular spines on the gill cover which are of similar length (the lower is noticeably longer on sand flathead)

Series of elongated black white-edged irregular blotches on the tail which are larger towards the bottom of the tail

Can grow up to ~70 cm (or more) in Port Phillip (whereas not many sand flathead grow to longer than ~35 cm)

Usually caught in deeper water compared to sand flathead

Rock Flathead (Platycephalus Laevigatus)

Identifying features:

Dark mottled greenish/ pale brown body with darker stripes and rows of spots radiating on a yellowish coloured tail

Two opercular spines on the gill cover with the upper being longer than the lower (bluespotted flathead have spines of similar length, with the lower spine noticeably longer on sand flathead)

More cylindrical/ rounded body shape compared with other flathead species.

Sand Flathead (Platycephalus Bassensis)

Identifying features:

Two opercular spines on the gill cover with the lower being longer than the upper (bluespotted flathead have spines of similar length, with the upper spine noticeably longer on rock flathead)

Generally grows up to 35 cm in Port Phillip.

Tiger Flathead (Platycephalus Richardsoni)

This species can also be found in Port Phillip.

Identifying features:

A greyish-brown flathead with a series of dark blotches along the side, and many small orange to reddish-orange spots covering the body.

The fins are spotted, and the caudal fin is mostly dusky, especially the outer middle part, with a few small faint dusky blotches dorsally.

Dusky Flathead (Platycephalus Fuscus)

This species is not found in Port Phillip.

Identifying features:

Commonly caught in estuaries east of Lake Tyers to Mallacoota Inlet (any flathead caught in Lake Tyers or further east will generally be considered to be dusky flathead) Single, large blotch towards top of tail (with distinct lack of blotches of lower half of tail)

Plastics in the seas.



The Ocean Cleanup crew just tested their *Interceptor Trashfence* in Guatemala's Rio Motagua Basin, home to what they believe is the world's most polluting river.

The river floods a number of times every year, and they prepared a trash fence to catch the plastics contained in the next flow.
