Kayaks.

Last week's blue skies and calm weather saw our Hire fleet come back into action. A big shout out to **Tom Noble**, who has the honour of being APYAC's first Kayak hirer.



Remember to shoot us an email <u>apyacboathire@gmail.com</u> if you would like to organize your induction, you don't need a Marine licence to hire a Kayak, but you do need to do the induction and fill out the online Risk Waiver form.

Electricity.

Winter is a good chance for the Boathouse Crew to attend to general maintenance. Currently **John Eddison** has been focusing on the electrical connections – this has come at a great time, as the Club is undertaking an energy consumption audit.

Our main concern is the multiplicity of electrical connections. Overused electrical leads of dubious standard, some intertwined on sprinkler pipes, near sprinkler heads, homemade power boards, unattended battery chargers in amongst flammable items, paint thinner lids being left off and non-approved connected lights.

We would like to stress to Boathouse boat owners that, battery charging can only be done if in attendance, unless discussed with the Boathouse crew (who will be happy to guide you regarding trickle chargers etc) and ideally on the floor, not inside your boat. Some batteries may be beyond their life and excess charging could cause a flammable situation to occur. Thank you, **Elise**, **Ian**, and **Tiburce** for making sure that we are compliant when it comes to our Fire Safety measures, no use having alarms if the batteries are still wrapped in plastic.

Approved electrical leads are fine to use, so long as connected and then disconnected after use from an installed power point. Please do not leave in place, switched on – think Green!

So, if you find that your leads/chargers etc aren't where you left them, they may be found in a box outside the maintenance room – please consult Ian Sekac if you have any questions regarding this clean up. <u>i.sekac@bigpond.com</u>

Plastics in the sea.

The Australian Marine Conservation Society writes:

Australia's National Packaging Targets set a goal to phase out problematic single-use plastics by 2025.

The ACT's ban on single-use plastic cutlery, drink stirrers and polystyrene food and beverage containers commenced 1 July 2021, with straws, cotton bud sticks and degradable plastics phased out on 1 July 2022.

South Australia's ban on single-use plastics commenced on 1 March 2021, banning single-use plastic straws, drink stirrers and cutlery. On 1 March 2022, polystyrene food & beverage containers as well as oxo-degradable plastics were added to the ban.

Queensland's initial ban on single-use plastics commenced on 1 September 2021, banning single-use plastic straws, drink stirrers, cutlery, plates, bowls and polystyrene food & beverage containers.

Western Australia's ban on single-use plastics commenced 1 January 2022, with enforcement delayed until 1 July 2022. The ban includes plastic cutlery, stirrers, straws, plates, bowls, cups, thick plastic bags, polystyrene food containers, and helium balloon releases. In stage two, now to be completed by 2023, takeaway coffee cups/lids containing plastic, plastic barrier/produce bags, cotton buds with plastic shafts, polystyrene packaging, microbeads and oxo-degradable plastics will be banned.

The New South Wales Government has passed laws to ban single-use plastic bags, plastic straws, stirrers, cutlery, plates and bowls, expanded polystyrene food service items, plastic cotton bud sticks, and microbeads in cosmetics. Lightweight plastic bags will be phased out by 1 June 2022 and the remaining plastics will be prohibited from 1 November 2022.

Victoria's government has committed to ban single-use plastics by 1 February 2023, including single-use plastic straws, cutlery, plates, drink stirrers, polystyrene food and drink containers, and plastic cotton bud sticks.

The Northern Territory Government has committed to ban single-use plastics by 2025, proposing to ban plastic bags, plastic straws and stirrers, plastic cutlery, plastic bowls and plates, expanded polystyrene (EPS), consumer food containers, microbeads in personal health care products, EPS consumer goods packaging (loose fill and moulded), and helium balloons. This may include heavyweight plastic bags, subject to a consultation process.

Tasmania has made no commitments to ban single-use plastics.

Plastic pollution has also been associated with disease on coral reefs. A recent study of the effects of plastic on 124,000 reef-building corals from 159 reefs in the Asia Pacific Region (including Palm Islands, Whitsunday Islands and Keppel Islands) found the likelihood of disease increases from 4% to 89% when corals are in contact with plastic.
