

VFA flood response.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority (VFA) are hosting fish salvages with worries that the excessive flooding will threaten native fisheries. With floodwater debris reducing oxygen in the water, significant fish deaths have already been seen in regional rivers, lakes, and creeks. The VFA is taking critical action to move fish in flood-affected waters to safer waters.

Kayaker's Reef funding announced.

Recently we received a visit from **Nina Taylor** MP, member of the Legislative Council, and the Labor candidate for Albert Park to take over **Martin Foley**'s seat in the Legislative Assembly. Her visit coincided with the Victorian Government's announcement of a \$50,000 contribution towards creating a new shellfish reef about 800 metres off the Kerferd Road pier to cater for the growing numbers of kayak fishers.

Minister for Fishing and Boating **Sonya Kilkenny** announced that "the funding will continue a partnership between the Victorian Government and the Albert Park Yachting and Angling Club, which initiated the concept of shellfish reef restoration in Port Phillip

Bay. It will complement the \$2.5 million already invested into shellfish and rocky reefs as part of the \$35m Go Fishing Victoria plan."

Albert Park Yachting and Angling Club President, **Peter Nevile**, said that the club was deeply concerned about the destruction of marine habitat and set out to do something about it approximately ten years ago. "Together with Victorian Fisheries (now the Victorian Fisheries Authority) we commenced planning to restore our shellfish reefs," he said.

"Subsequently we also partnered with The Nature Conservancy, and shellfish reef restoration in Port Phillip Bay became a reality; and this could not have been achieved without the financial support provided by the Victorian Government," Mr Nevile said.

Recently the club identified a need to create a reef close to shore to benefit kayak fishers, hence the name of Kayaker's Reef. The new reef will probably result in improved fishing for pier anglers too.

"The creation of new shellfish reefs results in a major increase in marine biodiversity, including fish life. Because they involve seeding with live mussels and oysters, they are not artificial reefs, but new living reefs. They even result in cleaner water as each live shellfish on the new reef can filter 200 litres of water per day" Mr Nevile said.
