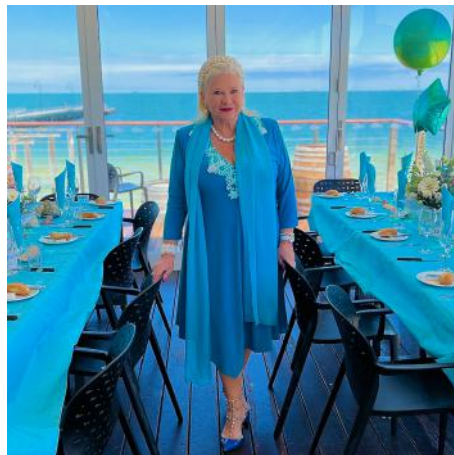

The grant also covers a new and improved Club door access system, and software. We are extremely grateful for the support provided by VFA to our Club.

Angling News.

Less than four weeks to Christmas, where has this year gone? The fishing and catching has been very good when weather permits. Some amazing fish have been caught and measured recently.

We hope any fish not required for your table have been measured and released.

It is great to see a junior member on the leader board with the longest snapper, nice one **Kye**, 91 cm. **Tony Panayotou** caught a large mulloway from his Kayak, definitely the largest Mulloway caught by a Kayak angler. I would think Tony may have thought he, and his kayak, were headed to Bass Strait when he hooked this monster, 110 cms. in length.

Good fish are definitely up the Club end of the Bay.

A couple of serious reminders to anglers, VFA rules are also our club rules along with Victorian Channel Authority and Victorian Police Rules. Anglers need to be sure they follow all rules. The Victorian Recreational Fishing Guide app has all the information regarding how many rods you can use at one time, number of fish per day you can catch, and sizes of fish you can keep.

It also has a great function called 'Can I fish here?' to ensure anglers are not in marine parks or shipping channels. The angling committee will take serious action if further breaches are reported or observed, and this can at the discretion of the angling committee include competition disqualification.

Pics of your fish must be forwarded to apyacanglers@gmail.com on the day the fish are caught. We have been lenient on this rule because it is a new way of entering fish. From now on the Angling Committee will be closely following this rule. You do not want your fish disallowed, so get the pics in smartly.

The Ron Amy Pot of Gold Snapper Competition starts at 12.01 a.m. this Saturday, 2nd of December, and closes at 12.30 p.m. on Sunday the 3rd. Lunch will be upstairs, and order from the kitchen. Winners must be at this lunch to receive their awards.
