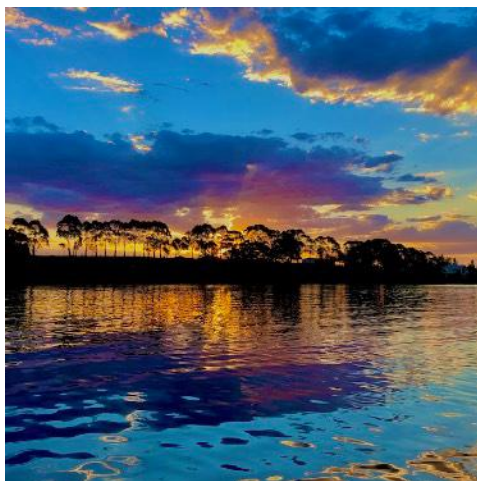

Angling News.

Presentation Night has been moved forward to Saturday the 15th of June. Please revise your diaries, it should be a great night. Keep an eye on Tight Lines for when bookings open, you do not want to miss out.

The weather has finally been great for fishing, the water temp is 21-22 C and we are having the normal cool mornings and warm afternoons with light winds. Easter looks like being exceptional, with temps forecast to be in the 30's with predicted reasonable winds although Monday may be damp.

As mentioned in the last issue of Tight Lines a number of our anglers headed to Lake Purrumbete and had a great long weekend's fishing. The Redfin were not as prevalent as previous years, but there were, as reported and shown in some great pics, good Trout and Salmon caught.

The amazing thing was trout were predominantly caught using pilchard fillets for bait.

The group had a great time, the fishing was good and the comradery outstanding. Jake Smith and his family took their clinker to the lake and had a fun weekend. The Lake Purrumbete Holiday Park has great facilities for anglers and families, book now so you get one of the better cabins.

The water temperature in the Bay is now as warm as it gets and means Flathead, Whiting, Snook, Garfish and Squid are on.

Squid, Snook, Gars and Whiting are generally found in large numbers in shallow water 2-4 metres over reefy, weedy areas with sand patches. Flathead in areas of sand. Drift for Squid and Flathead and anchor for Whiting, Gars and Snook, burley the key for all. Garfish are in the Bay in very large numbers so a float with a couple of small hooks and bread or similar burley good to attract them to you.

Snapper are still around the bottom end of the Bay and there have been reports there are a few around Williamstown. There is generally a late run now until the end of April, so it's still worth fishing for them. Good luck as the water cools there should be more snapper caught.
