Two-time President **Phil Langdon** took members down memory lane when he spoke at the July General Meeting. Speaking within sight of the appropriately-named Langdon Room, Phil told of spending much of his childhood at the Club. He caught his first fish when aged six, and reckoned that he is "*an average fisherman*". The room was named after his father --David, known to everyone as Dave-- who provided funding, much of the materials, and transport, to erect the extension to the Club in 1958.

Perched on a stool, Phil was a natural storyteller, being gently guided by podcast host **James Nixon**, in an entertaining Q&A session.

Phil lived the politics of the APYAC, the suburb of Richmond, where his father was the Mayor, being involved with football club, and being a Commissioner on the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. "*Everyone knew Dad,*" Phil said.

He described the Club as "*a special place to be.*" Starting as Vice President, Phil served two terms as President which has resulted in him serving as club leader longer than his father.

Phil said that it took a long time to persuade his wife, Robyn, to go to the club. After the first visit she was hooked by the friendliness of its members. At the time of the interview, they had been married 53 years.

He talked of the family business, Ace Packaging, with their Cartons Galore offshoot, and his love of his racehorses, both fast and slow.

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Angling Report.

The new season starts with a barbecue at the club on Sunday 25th of August. Prior to the lunch we plan to have a session on knot-tying and 'bait presentation'.

The 'reel' fishing starts at 12.01a.m. on September 1st. The first person to catch a Snapper (43 cms or more) gets their Club subscription paid for next year!

We have also changed the scoring system. A 43cm Snapper, (our minimum size), now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56cm will be 5.6 points, an 87cm fish 8.7 points, and so on.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to apyacanglers@gmail.com We will also show the fish caught, and where -we hope- on the WhatsApp APYAC Measure-in & Fishing Comps, the original WhatsApp Fishing Comp site.

We will also try to run a number of charters but that will depend on support, so keep an eye on Tight Lines.

Time to clean your fishing gear, grease reels, spray gear with protective coatings, wash rods and line.



Just because the competition season has closed does not mean the fish are on holidays, rug-up and wet a line. The weather has been exceptionally kind to anglers with many calm days, cool but calm, (this week excepted). The water temp is now around 11 degrees and Gummy Shark, Flathead, Australian Salmon, Whiting, Garfish and Squid are being caught in good numbers. Small snapper 'Pinkies' are almost in plague proportions over most reef areas. There is the occasional larger fish with them but you may catch 30 undersize-and-released fish to get one of size or bigger.

Squid and Whiting are generally found in large numbers in shallow water (2-4 metres) over reefy, weedy areas with sand patches.

Flathead are around in large numbers in areas of sand. Drift for Squid and Flathead and anchor for Whiting, burley the key. Garfish are in the Bay in very large numbers so a float with a couple of small hooks and bread or similar burley good to attract them to you.

For Salmon, if you see birds working cast a lure, or plastic, or troll around the area. Troll a lure up the Club-end of the Bay, and there are several species you may catch. Gummy Sharks are around too. Try deeper areas near channels, a few caught near P2. Use large baits, cutta, eel, mackerel, squid and pilchards.

I spent a lot of money on fishing gear, the rest I just wasted ... (apologies to Georgie Best)

The water is very clear and he uses the camera to find the second "gutter" which is around 50 to 100 meters offshore. He uses mostly live bait, then lures.

Fowlers Bay SA --population 12-- is slowly being eaten by a huge sand dune. Formerly known as Yalata, the town is located on Port Eyre, at the western end of the larger Fowlers Bay. Make a point of checking it out before it's too late.

Illegal net fishers in Port Phillip fined.

02 July 2024.

Two men from Altona Meadows have been convicted and fined nearly \$16,000 for illegally netting fish in Port Phillip last year.



Victorian Fisheries Authority (VFA) Director of Education and Enforcement **Ian Parks** said the men, aged 78 and 43, had pleaded guilty in the Melbourne Magistrates Court to several charges including the unauthorised use of commercial fishing equipment, illegally selling fish, and dealing in the proceeds of crime.

"The older man, who was fined \$5500, is one of eight remaining commercial licence holders in Port Phillip, permitted to catch fish on long lines, but not with nets, which were phased out from the bay in April 2022. The younger man was fined \$10,300," Mr Parks said.

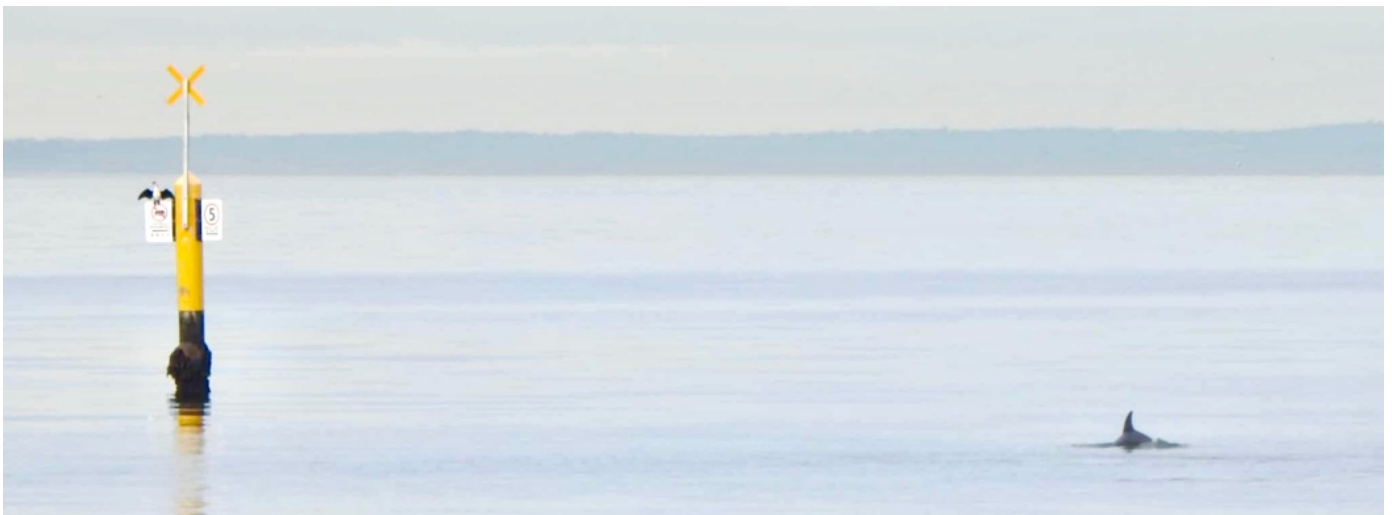
Officers also determined that the illegally caught fish had been sold at least five times to a seafood wholesaler in Melbourne.
