



President's Report.



Most of us, as we began our regular weekly routine on Monday, likely reflected on what a perfect Melbourne 'winter' weekend we'd just experienced. When Melbourne turns it on, there's no better place to be, especially as a fisher.

Catching a fish is just an added bonus; it's the time spent on or near the water, with the sun shining down, recharging our Vitamin D, and enjoying a tranquil space for reflection and rejuvenation.

COVID taught us the importance of prioritising our mental health as we navigate personal and professional challenges. While fishing might not seem like the most obvious self-care choice; for me, it's proven to be profoundly emotionally rewarding.

Fishing offers a unique way to stay physically active, get

outdoors, and connect with your body. It allows us to clear our minds and breathe deeply. Fishing is meditative -it gently encourages us to think, be patient, and relax. Breathing-in fresh air and observing the interplay between the sun, sky, and water helps us centre and recharge.

For me, fishing has become a vital part of my self-care routine to manage anxiety and stress. As I cast a line and wait patiently for a bite, I practice mindfulness. Fishing consistently provides a safe space for self-reflection and highlights the importance of making deliberate choices for our well-being.

This was particularly evident last Sunday. Although I only caught a few squid, it was such a magical day on the water, that even when we blew a tire on the Princes Freeway, with the boat attached, cars and trucks mowing us down, and having to be towed-home like a road train, I couldn't stop laughing. It was a perfect example of the mental health benefits of fishing - otherwise, I'd have just been plain stressed.

So as our new fishing season approaches, take the chance to jump onboard a charter, get your boating & fishing licence, do the boathouse induction, hire a boat or kayak, and become part of our wellness community. It's not about the prizes, but about the chill!

Finally, with the AGM coming up in October, we are calling for nominations to the Committee. If you have any thoughts of wanting to make a significant contribution to the Club, please feel free to discuss the



level of commitment required with me, or any other Committee member. As **Peter Nevile** used to say: 'Being on the Committee is not for the faint-hearted, and requires a great level of commitment, but there is also a great level of enjoyment'.

The recent crane training has highlighted how rules and practices have changed. We are considering having Induction Renewals every two years to keep owners, and those inducted for crane and boat use, up-to-date with the changes to regulations and equipment. This will mean your induction will only be current for two years. Better to be safe than sorry.

Last issue I let you know that I had been told that we don't do enough for boat owners who regularly fish. We are diligent in punishing boat owners who use the club as storage for their boats and not use them. Personally, I'd prefer 30 boats in the boat house used regularly by anglers, rather than 60 boats with only 20 of those regular users. This is probably a little controversial and needs input from boat owners --especially those who get out there on a regular basis. Last week's speaker

At last week's General Meeting, our speaker was **Andy Foudoulis** from OzFish.

OzFish Unlimited is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to helping the millions of Aussie recreational fishers take control of the health of their rivers, lakes and estuaries and shore up the future of the sport they love.

They partner with fishers and the broader community to invest time and money into the protection and restoration of our waterways, counteracting decades of degradation.

Andy has a very strong understanding and passion of fire ecology and conservation management. He has 13 years' experience in the Natural Resource Management



industry, where he learnt fundamental skills in managing remnant and degraded grasslands, and grassy woodland ecosystems in the northern parts of Melbourne. He has also spent time collaborating with traditional custodians on best practise, and giving TAFE and University talks --helping pave the way for future generations of conservationists.

The big issues facing fish habitat:

- 90% of shellfish reef has lost.
- · Most major rivers are de-snagged.
- · Seagrass has been lost.
- · Loss of salt Marsh.
- · Thousands of barriers to Fish foraging.
- · Unscreened irrigation pumps.
- · Coastal vegetation.
- Giant kelp forest are now considered functionally extinct.

OzFish's project work includes:

- · re-snagging
- · riverbank planting and bank stabilisation
- fish ways
- · bushfire, drought and flood recovery initiatives, including emergency fish relocations
- monitoring river health and educating future generations.
- waterway cleanups and sustainable fish education programs
- · shellfish reef restoration and shell recycling
- seagrass restoration

mangrove and saltmarsh restoration

- · habitat mapping
- · kelp restoration
- · citizen science including mapping, water quality testing, water bug monitoring, and
- · wetland restoration

Andy took us through three of their projects:

'Reef ball rejuvenation' a three year project funded by Victorian Fish licenses on the eastern side of Port Phillip.

'Shellsavers project' recovers used shell on the Mornington Peninsula.

'Lake Eppalock snagging' securing 70 logs to the lake floor to provide fish habitat.

Angling Report.

The new season starts with a barbecue at the club on **Sunday 25th of August**. Before lunch we plan to have a knot tying clinic, and a session on *'How to present baits to fish'*.

The 'reel' fishing starts at 12.01a.m. on **Saturday 7th September**. If you catch the first 43 cms (or greater) Snapper for the season your Club subscription is paid for next year.

Our first charter is planned Saturday 14th September. Come on

the 'Roland Nicholls Memorial Charter' and get on the scoreboard. This is a mixed charter and snapper over 43 cm will get championship points.

There's a catch: the Club's Committee will pay half of the charter but charter participants need to do Friday night raffle ticket, or door duty. This is not an onerous volunteer task, plus you get to meet a whole heap of new people! Raffle and door duty volunteers now get a meal and free drink. Email interest to **apyacanglers @ qmail.com**

Keep Sunday September 29th free. The Club has been invited to Victorian Fisheries hatchery at Arcadia, this side of Shepparton, about a two hour drive from the Clubhouse. Apart from a tour of the hatchery there is a large stocked lake in which you can try your luck. Good sized Murray Cod, silver perch, golden perch and trout all are waiting for you. Bring light spinning rods and reels, bail, lures and maybe even fly rods. Remember to bring your fishing licence.

There is a camping ground near the hatchery on the Goulburn River (also good fishing) and there are free showers and toilet facilities at the hatchery for those who may want to make a weekend of it.

We have also changed the scoring system so that even our Editor can understand --and maybe get *Slopalong Placidly* out for a fish-- a 43 cm snapper (our minimum size) now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56 cm will be 5.6 points, a 87 cm fish 8.7 points and so on.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to **apyacanglers** @ **gmail.com** but we will also show fish caught and (hopefully) location on the Whats App **APYAC measure-in and fishing comps**, the original Whats App Fishing Comp site.

We will also try to run a more charters but that will depend on support so keep an eye on Tight Lines.

The Fish are still out there, hard to catch from your lounge room, give it a go so you're ready for opening, but keep an eye on the weather.

Annual General Meeting - Wednesday 2nd October 2024

This notice specifies that the Wednesday 2nd October meeting is our Annual General Meeting.

The ordinary business of the Annual General Meeting shall be to:

- Elect officers of the Club and the ordinary members of the Committee; and
- · Confirm the minutes of the previous annual general meeting; and
- Receive from the Committee reports upon the transactions of the Club during the last preceding financial year; and
- Receive and consider the statement submitted by the Club in accordance with section 102(B) of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012, and
- Confirm or vary the amounts of the annual subscription and application fee.

Nomination to Committee

There are three committee places available for nomination under our collegiate system. Committee members are appointed for a three year term.

The Nomination Form will be available for download from the club's website, find the Nomination tab here.

1. Eligibility.

Only Full Members that have been financial for two years or more can nominate.

All financial Full Members are invited to nominate eligible members for the committee in accordance with the rules.

2. The Nomination process:

- Complete the Nomination Form, with a Proposer and Seconder who are full financial members for Financial Year 2024-5, (e.g. have paid their Annual Membership fees in full).
- Provide a photo and short biography / statement of intent.
- Email the Nomination Form, and supporting documents, to the Club Secretary (**secretary @ apyac.org.au**), no later than 5 p.m. 18th. September 2024.

3. The Election process:

- If there are three nominations or less, the candidates nominated will be deemed elected.
- If there are more than three nominations to fill the vacancies, copies of all nominations will be posted on the Club Notice Board, and a ballot will be held.
- Voting can only be done by attending the Annual General Meeting in accordance with the Club Rules. No proxy votes.
- Voting will take place prior to the Annual General Meeting on Wednesday 2nd October 2024.

4. Key Dates

11th September (-21 days) AGM notice, Agenda, Special Resolution (amending rules), Nomination Form.

18th September (-14 days) Nominations for election close at 5 p.m.

2nd October (0 days): Voting (6:00 - 7:30 p.m.). Annual General Meeting from 8 p.m.


