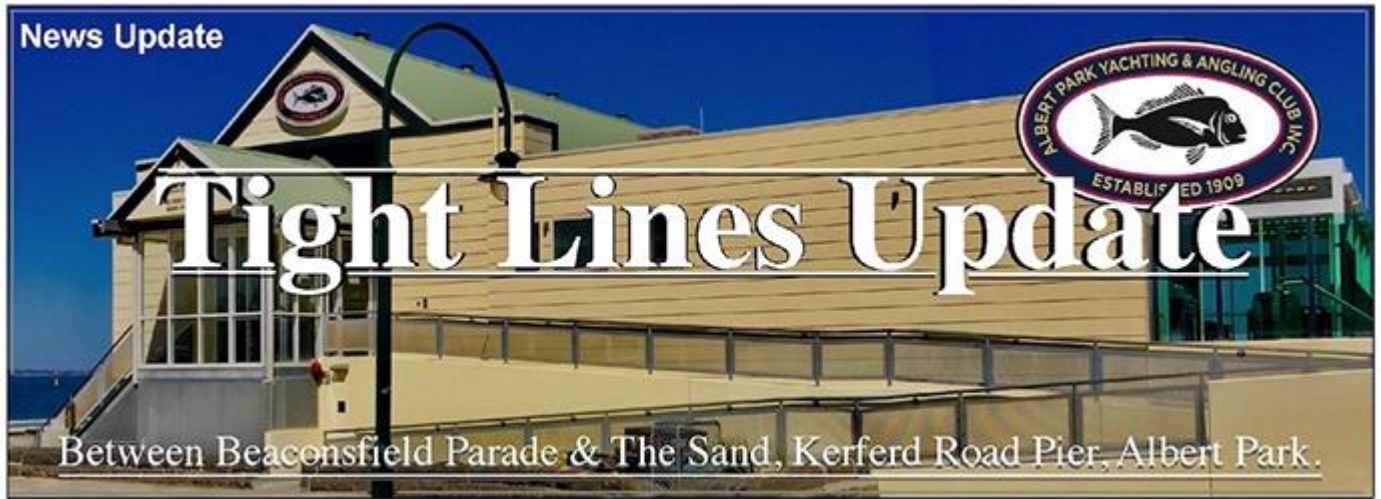

Our Boathouse Captain **John Spragg** will be there fishing the large stocked lake from 9 a.m. You can join him, trying your luck for Murray Cod, Silver Perch, Golden Perch and Trout - all good size and just waiting for you to catch them - so bring your rods, lures, baits etc and your Fishing Licence. *(That's a must!)*

Bring along your picnic lunch -there's BBQ facilities on site- you may even want to cook your catch!

Two Murray Cod were caught and released in the lake on Monday, one on raw chicken, and the other on cheese.

Why not make a weekend of it? Stay in Shepparton or Nagambie, or camp down the road beside the Goulburn River, (also good fishing). Arcadia offers free showers and toilet facilities at the Hatchery - gates open at sunrise.

By the deadline we had received only two Nominations for the three positions, which results in both being elected without a need for a vote. The new Committee members are:

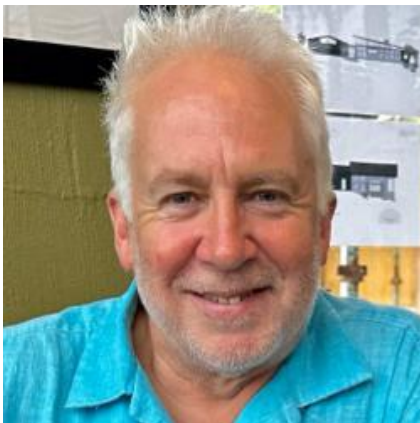
- **Barry Hayes**, and

President's Report.

Talk Wild Trout Conference.

As a budding conservationist, I couldn't be more excited to share my experience from the **'Talk Wild Trout Conference'**, held last Saturday in Mansfield. This event, organised by the Victorian Fishing Authority and Australian Trout Foundation, once again placed Mansfield at the heart of wild trout discussions, featuring an impressive lineup of experts. John Spragg and I felt honoured to be invited.

Featured Speakers:

- **Philip Weigall** - Author of eight books on fly-fishing shared insights from his 40+ years of experience, offering valuable tips on adapting techniques to different fishing conditions. **Check out his books here.**



- **Terry George** - President of the **Australian Trout Fishing Association** discussed strategies for enhancing Victoria's streams and rivers for the future.
- **John Billing** - '**Mending Casts**' - changing lives one cast at a time - a charity who provide free respite retreats to people dealing with cancer.
- **Karen Brooks** - World champion female fly fisho and casting coach emphasised the importance of increasing female participation in the fishing community, along with her partner, Peter, she now runs **Driftwater** - offering guided fly-fishing coaching and experiences.
- **Matt Tripet** - **The Fly Program** which is designed to get men outdoors, and get them talking about things men don't normally talk about. All too often Kiwi and Aussie blokes are more than satisfied to just keep everything to themselves, keep it bottled up, and consequently, their mental health suffers. Founder, Matt

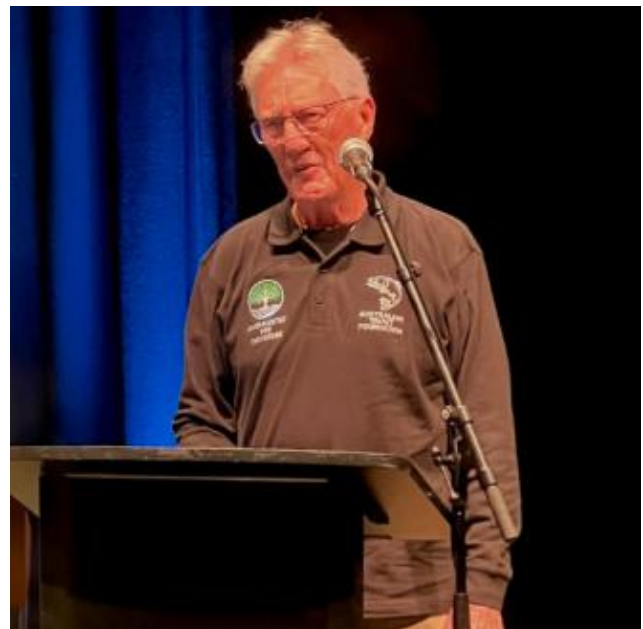
Tripet, has seen the proof of the benefit of the outdoors on men's mental health. Builder or barrister, the outdoors connects men. Standing alongside someone in a river, catching a fish with a fly you just made, breaks down barriers. It breaks down the walls the men create for themselves and allows them to be vulnerable.

- **James Norney** - from **Mountain Fly** explained how environmental restoration leads to healthier fisheries. His company also offers guided tours through some of Victoria's most beautiful waterways.
- **Shea Bloom** from the **Women in Recreational Fishing & Boating Network** shared insights on the growing number of women embracing fishing throughout Victoria, their Facebook page now has 4,400 followers. APYAC can proudly boast having had 4 WIRFAB leaders since it's induction in 2018.
- **Dr Jarod Lyon** - from the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action's Arthur Rylah Institute discussed co-managing trout fisheries alongside native species.
- **Victorian Fishing Authority** team, including **Taylor Hunt, Andrew Briggs,** and CEO **Travis Dowling,** rounded out the diverse group of presenters.

Conference Highlight

A standout moment was witnessing **Terry George** (*pictured*) receive the Victorian Fishing Authority's **Individual Award** from Chair **Graeme (Gus) Dear**, for his contributions to recreational fishing and river health. As he prepares to step down as President of the *Australian Trout Foundation*, Terry leaves behind an incredible legacy, having led **2,000 volunteers** to plant **35,000 trees**, across **38 projects**, on **24 waterways**, in **50 kilometers** of streams.

Terry shared an inspiring story about his drive to repair the damage caused by gold dredging, a legacy of his grandfather. His passion and determination are a testament to how one person can create significant change. Congratulations, Terry, and thank you for your



unwavering commitment. Our planet is a better place because of you!

The conference also highlighted the mental health benefits of fishing, with powerful presentations from John Billing and Matt Tripet. We're hopeful to bring Matt to our Club for one of our monthly meetings to further discuss these important topics.

As John and I reflected on our long journey home, we were both deeply impressed by the insights shared on the benefits of trout fishing and river restoration for mental health, regional economies, and environmental health. This conference has left a lasting impression on us both, reinforcing our commitment to conservation and community engagement.

If you want a morning of fun and the satisfaction of helping the club, come along Wednesday mornings at around 8.00 a.m.

A polite reminder to all boat owners with boats in the Boat House: fuel containers for petrol or diesel, shall not be left in and around boats stored in the Boat House. It is permissible to bring into the Boat House an approved fuel container for filling up a boat's fuel tank. Filling the boat tank should be done outside the Boat House on the concrete apron before launching, take the container out in the boat for fishing or for recreational activity as an added source of fuel, but that container should then be



removed from the Boat House. By adopting this agreed practice, a potential risk is minimised. There will be a time where we may have to remove any stored fuel not in the boat's fuel tank.



Boat owners please check your insurance is up to date, all boats in the boat house need to be insured, it is to protect the club and owners. Contact us **captain @ apyac.org.au** if any assistance required.

There is a boat for sale, see the ad below and the poster, and also a Kayak for sale, both in the Boat House. The Kayak is a *Hobie Revolution*, 13 ft long with full electronics. Email captain @ apyac.org.au and I will pass you details to the owners.

Boat house inductions are continuing, contact Ian Sekac at **i.sekac @ bigpond.com** if you have not already been booked-in and been contacted. We will be sure to let everyone know the date and time in Tight Lines.

Club Boat hire is being used on a regular basis. If you want to hire one of the club boats or kayaks contact Tom Harris at **tomharris.au @ gmail.com** Shortly this will be able to be done via the APYAC App --so stay tuned! Remember to open the fuel tank breather.

Angling Report.

Our First Charter on Sunday 15th September was postponed due to poor weather, all funds paid by hopeful participants should be back in your bank, let me know if they aren't. This charter was fully-booked and we had a waiting list.

We have re-booked for 13th October. The water and weather should be warmer, but the name has not changed, the Roland Nicholls Memorial Charter. This is a mixed charter, everything supplied, and no-experience needed. Snapper over 43 cm will get championship points. The boat Bacardi will leave from St.Kilda Marina at 5.00 a.m. so you will be catching fish at sun up when they bite best. It is a week after daylight saving starts. We will confirm the time to be on the dock closer to the event.

The Club's Committee will pay half of the charter cost, as charter participants need to do raffle ticket duty, or door duty, on a Friday Night. This is not an onerous volunteer task. Raffle and door duty volunteers get a free drink. Look for the flyer or the QR code up on club screens for the registration and payment details, get in quick. Most of the original team re-booked so do not delay booking.



We will also try to run a charter most months but that will depend on support so keep an eye on Tight Lines. Some dates will change.

We have also changed the scoring system a 43 cm snapper (our minimum size) now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56 cm will be 5.6 points, a 87 cm fish 8.7 points and so on.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to apyacanglers @ gmail.com on the day of the catch, but we will also show fish caught and we hope whereabouts, on the WhatsApp *APYAC Measure In & Fishing Comps*, (the original Whats App Fishing Comp site). Take a look at Harry's and Michael Briffa's fish.



We are cancelling the APYAC trip to the Fisheries hatchery at Arcadia on Sunday. It has been so cold that the Murray Cod have not spawned yet so there is not be a lot to see on the tour. I will go up anyway as I want to fish their pond, and take a look at the facility. If you want to have a fish with me, I'll be there from 9 a.m.

The weather has not been kind to boaters or anglers. The Bay temperature is still low -11 to 12C- the water needs to be above fourteen degrees to really bring on the real run of Snapper. Vic Fisheries expect a bumper season this year. Fish shallow water as it is slightly warmer, there have a lot of boats around Altona and Williamstown. Try the area around Blue Light and the back of Williamstown Footy Ground a good look, but watch the weather!

Whiting are biting down the south end of the Bay, well worth the trip. The Bait freezer has been stocked.

The App also includes a fully integrated Members Area. To log into the Members Area, use the same login details (membership number / password) as you currently do for the Member's Login on the club's website.

All functionality within the Member's Area including My Bookings, make a Booking, and Member Directory is provided in a mobile-friendly format for ease of use.

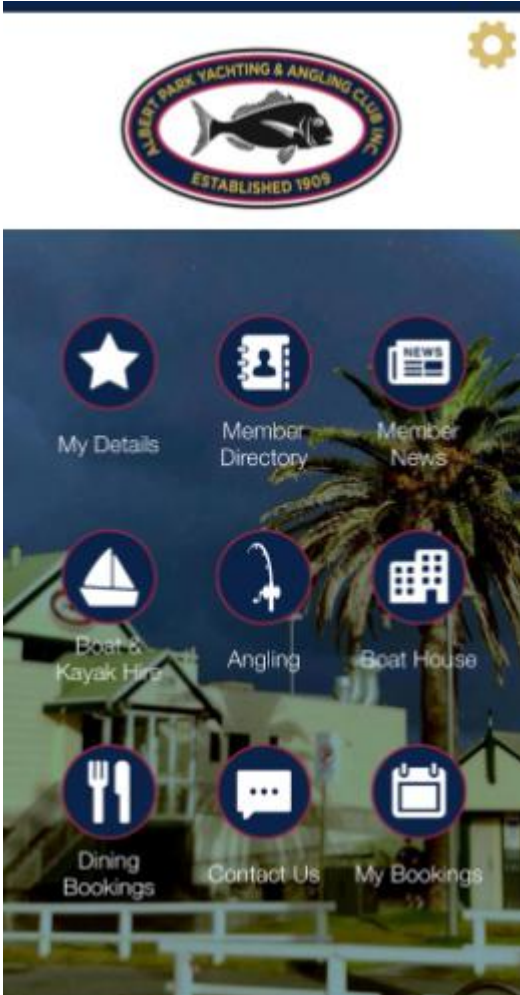
The App is now available for download from the iTunes (IOS) or Google Play (Android) app stores. To download simple search for Albert Park Yachting and Angling Club.

It forms an important part of the club's marketing and communications strategy and we would strongly encourage all members and visitors to download the App to their mobile devices. *Just a tip: it has two pages, so swipe right to see all the links.*

Over the next few months, we will be adding many more interactive features to the App platform, we'll let you know as they are released.

Here's a tip, go into the APYAC website, login and change your password (it's about time you did it anyway) ... THEN login to the App with the new password and it should work perfectly.

Another tip? To utilise Apple's App service you must be registered with an Apple iTunes account to download APPs --even though the app is free-- and that means that you must upload a payment option. If you don't want to use a credit card you can buy a voucher.

Click on 'Member Login.'



Step Three

Enter your membership number: [e.g.] 9999] minus the first 0 at the start of your member number

(see pic below).

Step Four

For the password, enter the **day** and **month** of your birth, without the year or any extra characters.

For example, if your birthday is the 13th of September, your password would be 1309.

Once logged in, you will be able to see all your details.

If you continue experiencing any issues, feel free to come down to the office between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
