



Angling.

Something new, we are looking at a 'learn to fly fish' trip to Noojee with Victorian Fly Fishers

Association and Hurley's Fly Fishing. It is for beginners or anyone who wants a few pointers on fly casting. We spend a couple of hours learning to cast on the grass and once you can cast a fly we move to a stocked lake and there is a very good chance of landing a fish. It is a catch and release lake. All ages welcome just must be able to move a fly rod, (just under 3 metres long). All gear supplied, with experienced tutors. Trout can be bought fresh, or smoked, at the facility. There are fishing ponds where you can catch and pay-by-weight any fish caught, rods and bait supplied and a barbecue area. Family and pet friendly, make a day of it. Whether it happened depends on interest, email me at johnrs3175 @ outlook.com. I am happy to take 4 people in my car if it happens. \$99 for teaching you to cast flys then probably catch a trout and release it. Another form of angling.

The Roland Nicholls Memorial Charter, I thought, went very well except the fish did not co-operate, the water is still too cold for the new run of snapper. 11 people went out and included two women, and we returned with the same 11. Breakfast was an egg and bacon sandwich and sausages in bread and was enjoyed by all after a 5.00 a.m. start on the water. A number of pinkies were caught and **Michael Briffa** landed a nice whiting and flathead, well done Michael.

The next Charter is Sunday the 3rd of November as part of the *Max Coningsby Snapper Comp*, all Charter Anglers are qualified in the comp. and with the experienced skipper **Steve Napoli** on *Bacardi* a charter angler has every chance of taking out the Max Coningsby Snapper Competition. Bookings open soon.

The Club will pay half of the charter cost, but charter participants need to do raffle ticket duty, or door duty, on a Friday Night. This is not an onerous volunteer task. Raffle and door duty volunteers get a free drink. Look for the flyer or the QR code up on club screens for registration, for the registration and payment details, get in quick.

We will also try to run a charter most months but that will depend on support.

We have also changed the scoring system a 43 cm snapper (our minimum size) now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56 cm will be 5.6 points, a 87 cm fish 8.7 points and so on.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to apyacanglers @ gmail.com on the day of the catch, but we will also show fish caught and we hope whereabouts, on the Whats App. *APYAC measure in and fishing comps*, (the original Whats App Fishing Comp site). **Chantal Meehan** is doing a great job posting the leader board in Tight Lines, and updating the *Roland Nicholls Score Board* in the club, a big thank you Chantal.


The trip to *Arcadia Hatchery* was postponed due to the cool weather. The Murray Cod have not yet spawned so there was nothing to see. We will let everyone know when Fisheries arrange a tour for us. The facilities there are first class.

The weather has not been kind to boaters or anglers. The Bay temperature is still low (14c) the water needs to be above 16c to really bring on the real run of Snapper. Vic. Fisheries expect a bumper season this year. Fish shallow water as it is slightly warmer, there have been a lot of boats around Altona, Williamstown. Try the area around Blue Light and the back of Williamstown Footy Ground. Lots of boats have been fishing in close from Hampton to Ricketts Point, they must be there for some reason. We believe most size and above snapper caught lately are resident Port Phillip Bay fish not the run of new breeding fish expected soon. November is normally the best Snapper month. Give it a go but watch the weather!

Whiting are biting down the south end of the Bay, well worth the trip.



Shrine to Sea Project

The Victorian Government has released the *Shrine to Sea Masterplan* which will create a new boulevard connecting the Shrine Of Remembrance to Kerferd Road Pier. 350 new trees, with 150 already planted, and more than 9000m² of woody meadows which will bring colour, and increase biodiversity links, in the local area.

The Victorian Government has invested \$13 million to support the planning and delivery of the project.



Over 100 exhibitors, hundreds of boats, new releases, and lots of boating fun.


