

As ever, many thanks to **lan Sekac** and the team of volunteers who work to continuously improve the APYAC Boathouse. A significant amount of effort is being undertaken to restore vessels owned by the club to their former glory. This week, particular thanks are due to **John Edison** who has done a great job installing a sensor light above the trip log at the southern end of the east aisle (see picture).

I'm sure this will be much appreciated by those early risers chasing snapper before sunrise.

Also at the south end of the east aisle, a freezer has been installed for exclusive use by Ascot Catering in the kitchen upstairs. This is for storage of food to be used upstairs, and must not be used by anyone other than Chris and his



staff. The freezer has a lock to prevent unauthorised use. If, for any reason, you find it unlocked, please report this to the Manager or Kitchen.

The hose reel for the electric crane in the east aisle has a jammed bearing and will be replaced imminently. In the meantime, please ensure the hose is left in a way that is not a hazard to boathouse users, or on the beach where members of the public may trip.

A couple of reminders for those who own a vessel in the Boat House:

- **URGENT**: Please complete and return the Acknowledgement of Understanding of the usage of the electric cranes. If you have not received such a document, please contact Ian Sekac.

- Please check your lifting equipment is compliant, in particular the condition and load rating of all shackles, chains and slings used to hoist your vessel.
- Spare fuel is not to be stored in the Boat House. Please bring your approved containers of fuel to the club, top up on the apron, take your fuel out with you, and take it home at the end of the day.
- To minimise the risk of fire, batteries are only to be charged whilst there is someone present who is responsible for monitoring it and taking action in the event of mishap. Batteries are not to be left charging overnight.

Finally, it was great to see **Bruce Bourne** and **Chris Herbert** building big sandcastles this morning using the boathouse bobcat ("Terex") in preparation for their accreditation.



Sprung!

A 56-year-old Brighton man allegedly took nearly four times the bag limit last weekend. On Friday night, Fisheries Officers inspected the man and his boat leaving the Hastings ramp, and found 18 snapper, of which 11 were over 40cm. The catch limit is 10 snapper per person, of which only 3 can be over 40cm.

Officers seized the man's 6.8m fibreglass boat on the spot, along with all of the fish and his rods. He will be charged on summons.

Anglers are encouraged to take only what they need and check snapper catch limits before they leave home (check them out here).

If you see or suspect illegal fishing, call 13FISH (133474) anytime to speak directly to a Fisheries Officer. You can remain anonymous.
