

### Boathouse.

With the weather getting better and big snapper on the bite, it is great to see so many people out on the water. We have had many first-timers seeking boat and kayak inductions recently, taking advantage of the Club's hire vessels. Where else can you spend a day on the water for \$50, including petrol and fish-finder?

Our final kayak and boat induction for 2024 will be held on Saturday December 14<sup>th</sup>. Please contact **Ian Sekac** (i.sekac @ bigpond.com) if you wish to attend this session. Whilst on the subject of hire boats, the Boathouse Report would not be complete without acknowledging the tireless efforts of Ian and



the enthusiastic volunteers that turn up each Tuesday and Wednesday morning. The work they do, including refuelling and checking the safety equipment on hire boats, continuously improves the Boathouse facilities and assets and is a benefit to all vessel users at the club.

A reminder that all persons aboard a vessel of 4.8 metres or less in length, must wear a life jacket at all times. This means donning the lifejacket correctly and fastening all buckles and clips, before stepping into your boat. Water Police place particular emphasis on safety, and failure to properly wear a lifejacket will likely incur a fine. I can confirm from experience (a visit to WatPol) that the camera at Water Police HQ in Williamstown can clearly identify vessels exiting St Kilda Marina, so the area around APYAC is well within their sights.

Finally, old equipment in the Boathouse is gradually being upgraded. The compressed air hose in the centre aisle has been replaced. The auto-retracting reel for the hose on the electric crane in the centre aisle is about to be replaced. In the meantime, please take particular care when using this, as it can foul on boats on the upper storage spots.

After the conclusion of the angling season, the electric crane in the centre aisle will be serviced, and that in the west aisle replaced.

The *Ron Amy Pot of Gold Snapper Comp*. runs from 12.01 a.m. Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> and closes off 12 noon Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> of December. Double points for Snapper above 43 cm.

Snapper season has arrived in force, there were some great catches the last couple of weeks. There are plenty of our members doing well. Weather has been kind and the fish plentiful. As predicted by Victorian Fisheries it looks to be a bumper season.

The charter that was fully booked for 2<sup>nd</sup> of November had to be cancelled due to a failed propellor shaft on the charter boat. That has been fixed so keep the Olga's Mixed Charter in mind. Thanks Olga.

Our scoring system is a 43 cm snapper (our minimum size) now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56 cm will be 5.6 points, a 87 cm fish 8.7 points and so on.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to apyacanglers@gmail.com on the day of the catch, but we will also show fish caught and we hope where abouts, on the Whats App. APYAC measure in and fishing comps, (the original Whats App Fishing Comp site). We are looking at a "learn to fly fish" trip to Noojee with Victorian Fly Fishers Association and Hurley's Fly Fishing. It is for beginners or anyone who wants a few pointers on fly casting. We spend a couple of hours learning to cast on the grass and once you can cast a fly we move to a stocked lake and there is a very good change of landing a fish. It is a catch and release lake. All ages welcome just must be able to move a fly rod ( just under 3 mts long). All gear supplied, very experienced tutors, trout can be bought fresh or smoked at the facility, there are fishing ponds where you can catch and pay by weight any fish caught, rods and bait supplied and a barbeque area. Family and pet friendly, make a day of it. Whether it happened depends on interest, email me at johnrs3175@outlook.com. I am happy to take 4 people in my car if it happens. \$99 for teaching you to cast flys then probably catch a trout and release it. Another form of angling when the snapper have breeding on their minds.

The weather has been kind to boaters or anglers. The Bay water temperature is good (17C). There have been a lot of boats around Altona, Williamstown. Try the area around Blue Light and the back of Williamstown Footy Ground. Lots of boats have been fishing in close from St.Kilda to Rickets Point, they must be there for some reason. Fish are being caught in the shipping channels, moor outside all exclusion zones and cast into the channels. Make sure you are out of any shipping exclusion zone or it can get very expensive. You do not need to travel far from the club to get fish at present, silver whiting, pilchards and salmon fillets or plastics seem to be the best baits. Give it a go but watch the weather!

# Sprung (again)!

#### **ABALONE THIEVES COLLECT THOUSANDS IN FINES**

The Lorne community is being praised by Fisheries Officers after information from the public led to the apprehension of 11 illegal fishers from two separate groups near Cathedral Rocks.

Victorian Fisheries Authority CEO **Travis Dowling** said calls from community members through the 13FISH (133474) reporting line helped officers plan a patrol at the popular location east of Lorne last week.

"Our Apollo Bay-based officers received reports of multiple groups of fishers allegedly collecting several species of shellfish, molluscs and crabs from the intertidal zone and during the abalone closed season for central Victorian waters," he said.

"Officers first encountered a group of seven people in possession of more than 100 abalone, including 24 that were undersize, 92 red shore crabs and approximately 15 litres of mixed molluscs. They had also allegedly used an incorrect tool to remove the abalone.

"The second group, comprising of four people, was intercepted with 193 red shore crabs (bag limit 30 per person), 24 abalone (14 undersize) and half a litre of molluscs.



"Individuals from both groups will face fines of up to \$2,174 each for offences including taking abalone during the closed season, exceeding the abalone bag limit, taking molluscs from the intertidal zone, and exceeding the bag limit for red shore crabs.

"We say a big thanks to those eagle-eyed residents who had been in touch with our Fisheries Officers for playing a vital role in looking after our fisheries."

Cathedral Rocks is within the Central Victorian Waters abalone zone, which opens on most weekends and public holidays from November 16 to April 30 every year.

Apollo Bay-based Supervising Fisheries Officer **Scott Hanger** said it was a timely reminder about the importance of 13FISH callers ahead of the region's busiest time of year.

"We're approaching peak season in areas like Lorne with snapper being caught off the rocks, Central Victorian abalone waters opening soon, and rock lobster season

beginning on November 16, so the more eyes we have out there the better," he said.

"We encourage anyone who sees or suspects illegal fishing to ring 13FISH to speak directly to a Fisheries Officer. Callers can remain anonymous."
