

Notice Of Special Business

At the next General Meeting, to be held at 7 p.m. on **Wednesday 5th February**, we will be conducting some Special Business. We'll be asking members to vote Yes or No on two resolutions:

1. Resolution One - To Remove the Auditor

The Committee believes it's time to change Auditors, due to:

- · Audit quality issues,
- · Expertise mismatch, and
- Compliance & regulatory changes.

2. Resolution Two - To change a Club Rule to reduce the number of voting members required for a Quorum.

The Committee recognises that, with 2,000 members, getting 5% of Voting Members to roll-up to the Meetings is difficult. When there were only 500 members it wasn't so hard. So we want to make it a manageable number.

Rule 17. QUORUM AT MEETINGS

CURRENT RULE 17.2

5% of all members personally present or by proxy (being members entitled under these Rules to vote at a general meeting) constitute a quorum for the conduct of the business of a general meeting.

PROPOSED RULE 17.2

30 members personally present or by proxy (being members entitled under these Rules to vote at a general meeting) constitute a quorum for the conduct of the business of a general meeting.

Any person of the age of 18 years or above, having served two years as a full financial member with non-voting rights may become a *Full Member with Voting Rights*.

Boathouse.

With the arrival of a new year, there is an unmistakable buzz around Melbourne that can only mean one thing: the upcoming *APYAC Australia Day Clinker Boat Race*. A great addition this year will be the availability of breakfast at the club. A reminder that all vessels and participants must register in advance. Please see full details elsewhere in this edition of Tight Lines.

It has been relatively quiet in the Boathouse during the holiday period, with many volunteers taking a well-earned break. Whilst the regular sessions are scheduled to restart on the 4th and 5th of February, volunteers are already returning.

We have been very fortunate to receive a two-person kayak, very generously donated by **Tiger Yan**. We are currently preparing it for hire and will advertise when it is available. Tiger is the process of joining the club. Many thanks, Tiger, we look forward to seeing you around the Boathouse!

On the subject of boat hire, the next hire boat / kayak induction will be held in the Boathouse at 8:30 a.m. on February 22nd. Please contact **Ian Sekac** (i.sekac @ bigpond.com) if you wish to attend this session. An induction is a prerequisite of hiring a club vessel. Finally, to help you stay on the right side of the law, I'd like to share a couple of recent experiences passed on to me.

The first is in relation to life jackets. In a recent Tight Lines, I noted that ALL straps, zips, buckles must be fastened correctly.



If they not, you are not considered to be wearing a life jacket. Furthermore, make sure you are wearing the correct life jacket for the vessel in/on which you are travelling. For example, if you are wearing a level 50, which can be used on a jet ski, and then get into a boat, which requires level 100 on enclosed and open waters, you can be fined for using an inappropriate jacket.

The second is more obscure experience, where someone was fined while towing his vessel while the plastic bung plugs were unscrewed and hanging partially out of the vessel. The offence was an unsecured load whereby the bung could come loose and hit a following vehicle. The lesson here is, if you wish to drain water while towing, remove the bungs completely -- just don't forget to replace them!

Stay safe on the water.

Angling.

We hope everyone had a great Christmas and a safe and Happy New Year -ready to hit the Bay and dangle a line.

A giant thank you to **James Nixon** who gets Tight Lines to you every two weeks, along with being the Club Secretary, Master of Ceremonies on Friday nights, hosting a business luncheon once month, is found at the club most Saturdays playing cards; and all this fitted-in with answering aviation questions on the ABC, 3AW and the TV stations. The Angling Group thanks you.

Our anglers, in our annual competition, number 35, including eight juniors. They landed 186 snapper from September until December. Many new names on the score board which is sensational news. APYAC is an angling club.



Our scoring system has not changed for 2025, a 43 cm snapper (our minimum size) now will be scored as 4.3 points, a 56 cm will be 5.6 points, a 87 cm fish 8.7 points, and so on.

Next competition is the Tiger Lyons Whiting Team Competition so start getting your whiting gear ready, and a partner to fish with. Dates are 8th & 9th Feb. There will be a further update on rules in the next issue of Tight Lines. Olga is running a charter on the Saturday so anglers without a boat can still take out prizes. Stay tuned.

Photos of fish caught will still need to go to **apyacanglers @ gmail.com** on the day of the catch, but we will also show fish caught and we hope where abouts, on the Whats App. 'APYAC measure in and fishing comps', (the original Whats App Fishing Comp site). Chantal is doing a great job posting the leader board in Tight Lines and updating the *Roland Nicholls Board* in the club. A big thank you Chantal, who is still on one leg.

Anglers who buy bait from the club, please fill out the docket fully and write your name clearly, we also have a number of angers who do not circle how the bait is being paid. Our crystal ball is cloudy and we cannot read hieroglyphics.

We are looking at a *'learn to fly fish'* trip to Noojee in March with Victorian Fly Fishers Association and Hurley's Fly Fishing. It is for beginners or anyone who wants a few pointers on fly casting. Email me at johnrs3175 @ outlook.com. I am happy to take four people in my car if it happens. \$99 for teaching you to cast flys then probably catch a trout and release it. Another form of angling when the snapper have breeding on their minds. I will confirm the March date in the next issue. It will be open to members, friends and family. If we get good

numbers, we will put on a barbecue or put some money over the bar at the famous Noogee Pub (for lemon squashes of course).

The weather has been kind to boaters and anglers. The Bay water temperature is good (21.88c top end of the bay 21.53c Mid Bay, Ocean 19.28c)

Snapper are not biting, you may see them on your sounder but they will generally not take a bait, too busy mating I believe. Pinkies are on every reef area, and can be a pain taking your bait before Whiting see it.

Whiting have been patchy, some of our anglers have had great catches then next day quiet. Keep moving until you find them. Good reports near North Road boat ramp, and Ricketts Point. Pipis, fresh mussels and thin strips of squid are the best baits. There are also a lot of Gars in the Bay at present, they are worth a try.

A few of our members tried Western Port while our competitions only include fish from Port Phillip. Reports were not too bad, whiting were caught, and Richard Muscat caught at least one very nice Tuna.

Members have caught some very nice Flathead and Australian Salmon in the Bay. Give it a go, but watch the weather. There have been some extreme, fast-moving fronts with strong winds the last few weeks -normal for summer- just take care!

I honestly believe fish bite twice a day; just before I get there, and just after I leave. (might be me)

lan Sekac and his energetic team of 10 - 15 boathouse volunteers meet on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings. As well as consuming tea, coffee and homemade cake, they carry-out menial tasks of clearing the sand from the apron, remove rubbish, tidy the kitchenette, refurbish the boat dollies, help boat owners solve problems, and complete the odd job.

Along with the mundane they undertake *major projects*. The 2024 list of achievements is so long that the Editor resorted to ChatGPT and asked that it be condensed to 200 words:

'The Boat House underwent extensive upgrades and improvements. LED lighting was installed throughout, bait storage was standardised, and lockers were labeled with owner



details. The trip record desk was relocated with a sensor light, fish weigh scales were reconditioned, and a new BBQ was purchased. Water-diverting drains were added in the West aisle. Volunteers gained TEREX PT-30 loader accreditation and showcased Clinker boat restoration to Albert Park College. Old engines, including the Simplex and Volvo Penta MD7A, were restored. Airline systems for gantry hoists were improved, and ongoing de-rusting and zinc applications were carried out.

The workshop was modernised with DeWalt cordless tools, a pedestal grinder, trolley jack, AC/DC welder, and new woodworking tools. Fasteners were organised, and air lines were updated for the gantry crane. Hire boats and kayaks were upgraded with fish finders, WorkSafe-compliant slings, and regular maintenance. Fifty-four members were inducted, and two experienced owners authorised to conduct inductions.

WorkSafe initiatives included crane training for 10 members, logbooks for cranes, updated safety policies, sunscreen dispensers, and a spare safety grab kit. The efforts of volunteers have enhanced safety, functionality, and the Boat House's ability to support its members and ongoing restoration projects.'

It's an impressive list, and the entire group deserves our thanks and congratulations.

History.

Far from being a dry account of monies spent, and motions forwarded and passed, the Minute Books offer a rich vein of insights into how the Club became what it is today. We will be sharing some of the important (and



also lighthearted) moments in our shared history in Tight Lines in the coming months.

Snookered

For many clubs, and indeed, some homes, the billiard table was a recreational focus long before social media came along.

The Club has had a mixed relationship with billiards and snooker. While we have had success that goes back over 80 years in competition, having won the B grade final Clubs final in 1944, the provision of billiards at the club has also proven a challenge due to costs and occasionally conflicts arising, with complaints being made to the Committee over a variety of issues. Still, billiards was always a popular pastime for members.

And the cue aficionados were also generous: snooker/pool charges were increased to one shilling for up to four players, and sixpence a stick for five players in late 1951. The money went to the Children's Christmas Trust. (28 November 1951).






